Objectives

From South Sudan, the Middle East and Central America to Congo, Colombia and the Philippines, the Catholic Church is a powerful force for peace, freedom, justice and reconciliation. But such impressive and courageous peacebuilding by Catholic communities often remains unknown, under-analyzed and unappreciated.

With this premise and anticipating the 50th anniversary of *Pacem in terris,* this seminar hopes to yield two beneficial outcomes:

- 1. To contribute to better mapping and analysis of best practices of contemporary Catholic peacebuilding as carried out in various ways at various levels of society; and
- 2. To consider how *Pacem in terris* remains a living teaching that can inform and inspire the further development of the Catholic theology, ethics, practice, and spirituality of peacebuilding.

With these overarching objectives in mind, this seminar is designed to elicit insights and explore challenges for the future of Catholic peacebuilding, including ways in which the Church's approach to peacebuilding constitutes a growing edge for Catholic Social Doctrine and theology. Among the questions to be discussed are the following:

- How would current approaches to peacebuilding be different if they were defined more explicitly in terms of a vocation of the Church and individual Christians to be peacebuilders?
- How could new approaches to governance, sovereignty, mediation and post-conflict reconciliation inform further theological and ethical reflection, and benefit from them?
- What is the relationship between peacebuilding and other themes, such as human rights or reconciliation, which are central to *Pacem in terris* and Catholic Social Doctrine generally?
- To what extent do the Church's beliefs, principles, and practices offer distinctive contributions to the theory and practice of peacebuilding?
- To what extent do Catholic approaches share features in common with other religious and secular forms of peacebuilding?
