### **Conference on the Future of Catholic Peacebuilding, April 13-15, 2008, University of Notre Dame**

A major conference for scholars and practitioners to reflect on the theological, ethical and practical dimensions of the Church's peacebuilding work. The conference is connected to a major research project which will produce a major book on the theology, ethics, and praxis of Catholic peacebuilding. It will also provide an opportunity to reflect on lessons learned from Catholic peacebuilding around the world and future directions for this often unexamined and unheralded dimension of the Church's ministry.

The conference is sponsored by the Catholic Peacebuilding Network; co-sponsors include Boston College's Department of Theology and Center for Human Rights and International Justice, Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Theological Union's Bernardin Center for Theology and Ministry, Georgetown University's Berkley Center for Religion, Peace, and World Affairs, Pax Christi International, the Sant' Egidio Community in the United States, University of Notre Dame's Joan B.
